Chattahoochee Valley Libraries is committed to providing free access to information in a full range of formats. The Internet is one of the resources offered by Chattahoochee Valley Libraries, and as such, enables the library to provide access to ideas, information, and materials from around the world. The Internet is a tool that further enhances the library's resources and collections.

The Internet is an unregulated medium. The Internet offers access to many valuable local, national, and international sources of information. However, the information found on it may be inaccurate, incomplete, or offensive to some individuals. Even though the filtering system we use is designed to stop sexually explicit or extremely violent sites from being accessed, no filtering software is 100% effective. The library staff cannot be responsible for the content of the Internet. However, library staff can ask customers to refrain from viewing inappropriate material missed by the filter. Users of the Internet must exercise judgment and evaluate for themselves the information accessed online.

Computers are available on a first come first serve basis. Individuals must use their own library card to log into library computers. Library cards allow unlimited one-hour computer sessions per day, as long as a computer is available.

Visitors without a library card may use a computer pass, available at the service desk. Visitor passes allow up to three hours of computer use per day. Any customer who uses a library card or visitor computer pass is expected to abide by the Library's Computer/Internet Use Policy and the Library's Code of Conduct Policy.

Parents are responsible for monitoring their children's use of the Internet and for the information accessed by their children. The library strongly recommends that parents supervise their children's Internet use.
