

The Chattahoochee Valley Libraries may show films to enrich the cultural experiences of members of the community and/or to promote literature.

Films may be chosen to:

- Promote and demonstrate film as an art form
- Promote literature or reading
- Celebrate a holiday or event
- Promote the understanding of a culture or people
- Give insight into a historical event
- Offer a diversity of ideas and expression

The showing of a film does not imply agreement with or approval of the content. Films will not be excluded because their topics might be controversial.

Not all films shown will be appropriate for all audiences. Parents should not assume that all films shown are appropriate for children, including teens. The film's Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) rating, if available, will appear on library publicity and advertising.

Signs at the location of the film showing will indicate the age appropriateness of the film. For all movies, age appropriate notice will be given to parent of the age appropriateness of the movie.

It is the library's intent that people attend age appropriate films. Parents are responsible for monitoring their children's viewing of library films. The library will make its best effort to screen and deny admittance to children to R rated movies but the library strongly recommends that parents supervise their children's film attendance.

Only films for which the library has performance rights may be shown.
